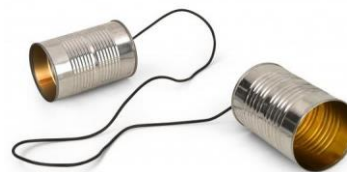

Please make plans to join us for the services needed. More details to come in the coming weeks pertaining to the Mexican Consulate.



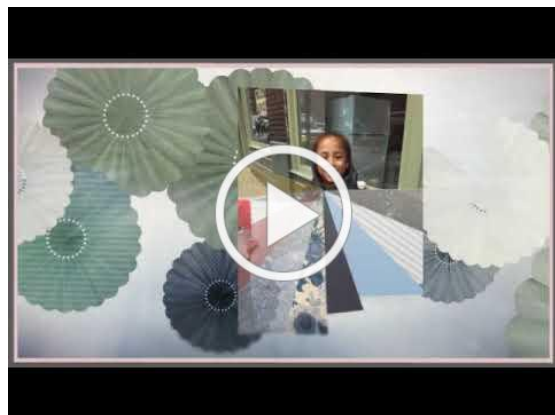
## Impact for Eternity Camp

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## Whiz Kids Unplugged: Working for a Good Cause

In the fall of 2017, the girls of the [Whiz Kids Unplugged](#) program planned a fund raiser to raise money for Matthew 25 Ministries (M25M) after they had heard about the various natural disasters that had taken place in Puerto Rico and Mexico.

Last month, the girls took a field trip to [Matthew 25 Ministries](#) to deliver the money they raised, and while there, they took a tour of the facility. After going on the tour, one of our students, Priscilla was compelled to do more, which spurred a brainstorming session with some of the other girls of what they could do to help. On the tour they learned that M25M recycles plastic grocery bags and uses them to make sleeping mats for victims of natural disasters all over the



world. This inspired them to organize a school-wide drive to collect as many plastic grocery bags as possible to be donated to M25M. Their goal is to collect at least **3000** plastic grocery bags during the month of April. As an incentive for students to help accomplish this goal, the Whiz Kids Unplugged girls have made a deal with Mr. Minera, a teacher at Roberts Academy. If they reach their goal of 3000 bags, they will earn the pleasure of giving him a makeover for the day. In addition to this, the class that collects the most plastic bags will get a free 30 minutes to play outside at the end of the school day.
